Independence Day is an important day in the life of every Indian citizen. Being an Indian he should respect our country. Independence Day generates a feeling of patriotism among people.

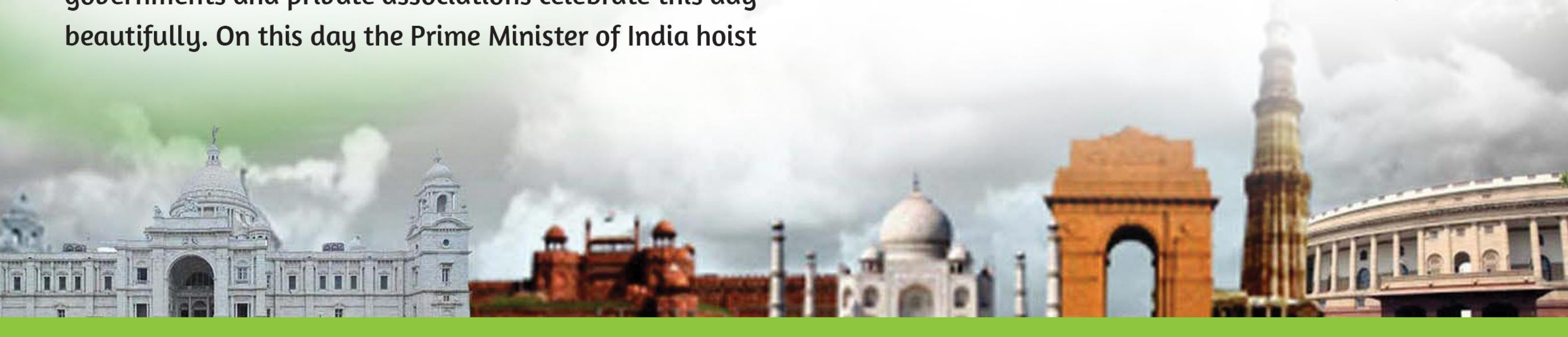

INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY

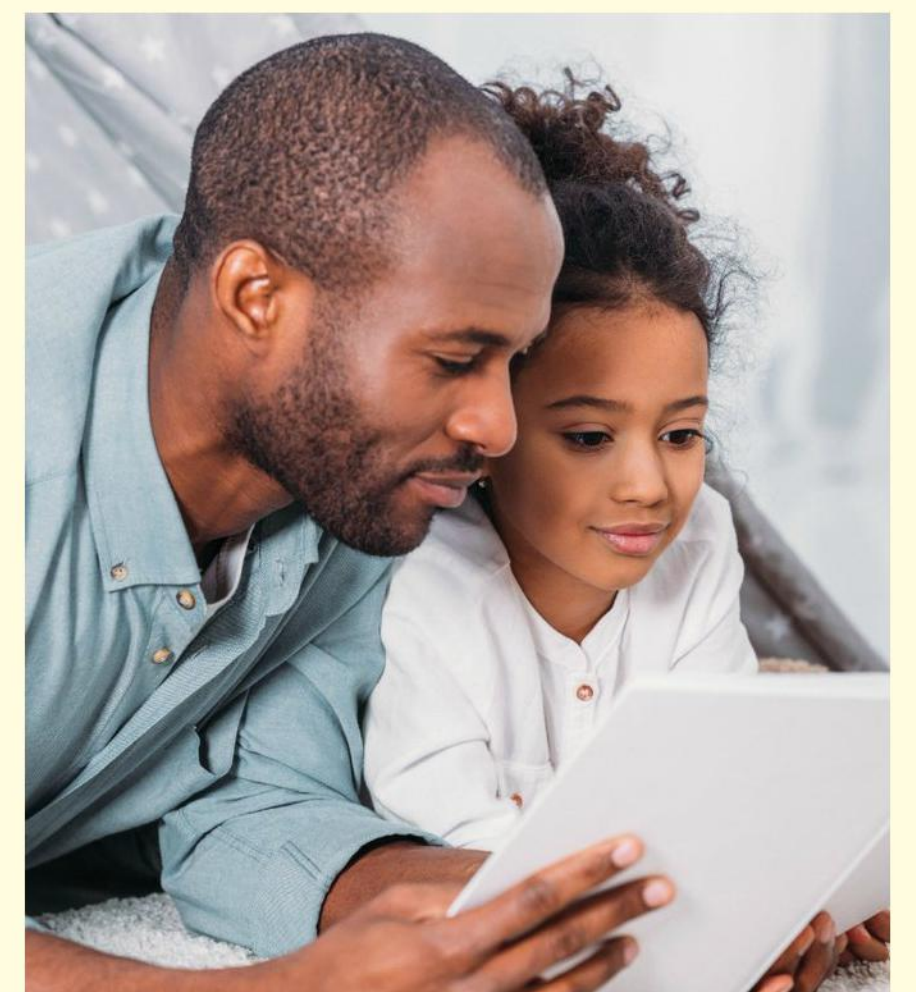

One of the major festivals celebrated by Malayali Hindu community, Onam marks the beginning of the annual harvest season in the southern parts of India. It is celebrated with great enthusiasm and accompanied by multiple festivities throughout Kerala and is treated as the official state festival.

According to legends, Onam is celebrated to commemorate the arrival of King Mahabali from Patala. The story goes that the demon King Mahabali who ruled in Kerala was loved by all for his generosity and kindness. This threatened the Gods and they sought Lord Vishnu's help who disguised himself as a poor Brahmin and headed to Kerala. He asked the king to give him land that can be covered within three feet and Mahabali granted his wish. Soon, the Brahmin started to grow in size and covered the sky and earth with his first and second step. Before he could take his third step, the king offered his head for the last step which led him to Patala.

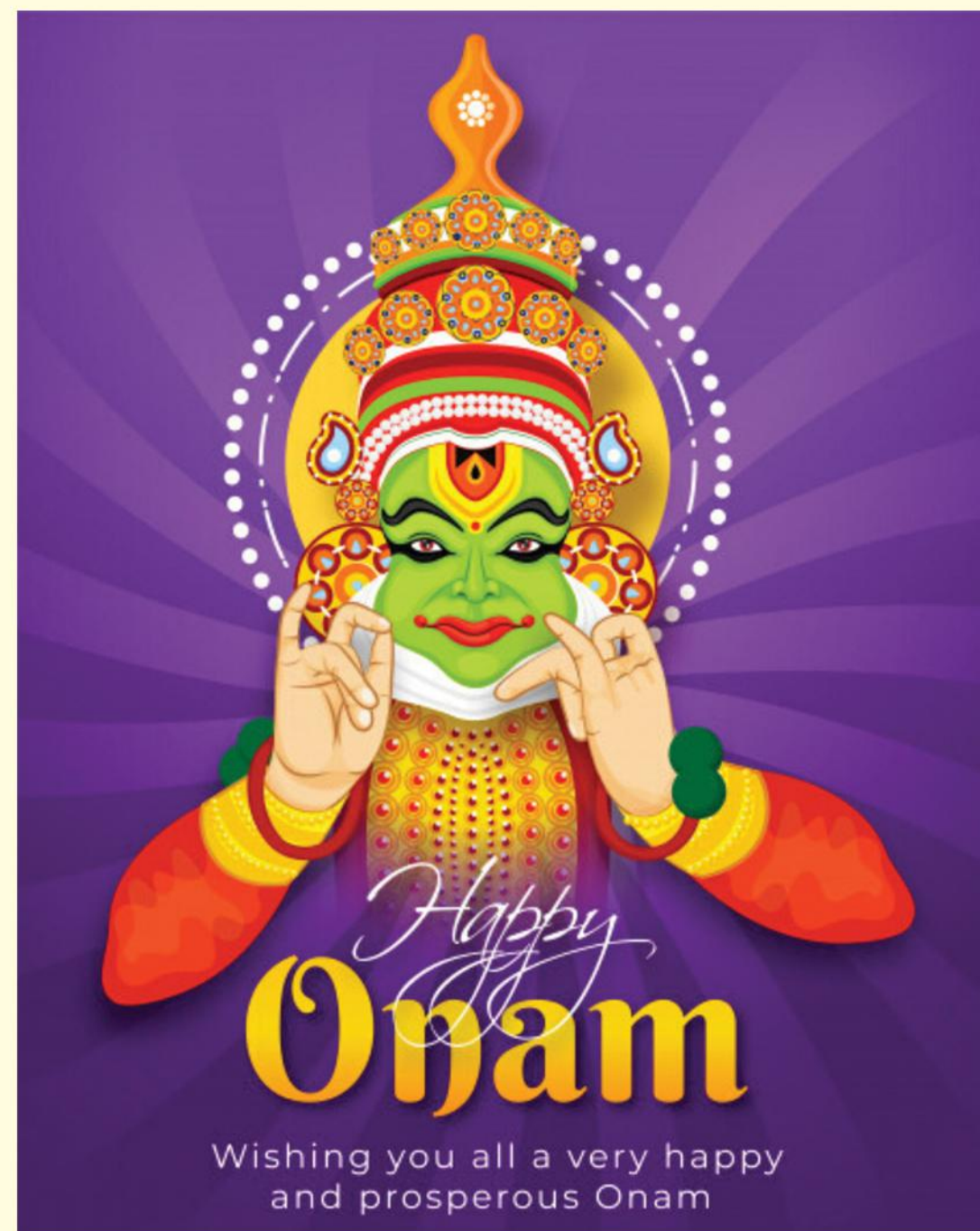
However, the king was granted a blessing for his good deeds to visit his people once every year. Onam marks the day of his annual visit to Earth.

Although Onam is a significant festival for Malayali Hindus, all communities in Kerala celebrate this festival with great zeal. The celebrations of Onam go on for 10 days and include multiple colourful events, starting with Atthachamayam featuring a street parade with folk songs and dance, carnival floats and decorated elephants walking down the roads. Other festivities include Pookalam (flower arrangement), Pulikali (masked tiger dance), Vallamkali (snake boat race) and other traditional arts and games.

Onam Sadya, a nine-course traditional feast, is prepared on the 11th day to honour the return of the king and the next day, the clay pyramids representing the king called Onathappan are immersed in water and the pookalams are wiped out. The activities continue for one more day.

HOLY ROSARY

The month of October is dedicated to the most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical lady of the rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th. It was instituted to honour the blessed virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. This feast was introduced by Pope St Pius V in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The pope attributed more to the arms of the rosary than the power of cannons and the valor of the soldier who fought there.



The Rosary is taken from the Latin word “rosarium” which means “crown of roses” or “garland of roses”. Devotion of the rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic spirituality. The rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. The rosary draws its mysteries from the new testaments and is centred on the great events of the incarnation and redemption.

In 2002 pope John Paul II added a set of five to the existing 15 mysteries and these became known as Luminous mysteries. Today the total number of mysteries is twenty.

Rosaries are not just beads or a prayer that we recite during the month of October. Before going to Virata, they are known to have hung their celestial weapons in a Shami tree for safekeeping for a year. It was during this time that Kauravas decided to attack the kingdom in which Arjuna retrieved the weapons from the Shami tree and defeated the entire Kaurava army.

In South India, the Nine-day festival of Navratri • In Nepal, the 15-day festival of Dashain • In Northern India, the tenth day of the festival, Vijayadashami. Vijaya Dashami, Dasara or Durgotsav is celebrated in a variety of ways in South India. The celebration ranges from praying to the Goddess Durga, Goddess Lakshmi and Goddess Saraswati to lighting up temples and Mysore Fort.

In most of northern India, Vijayadashami is celebrated in honour of Lord Rama. In many places, the Ramlila, a dramatic performance of the story of Rama is enacted over the 9 days leading up to the festival.

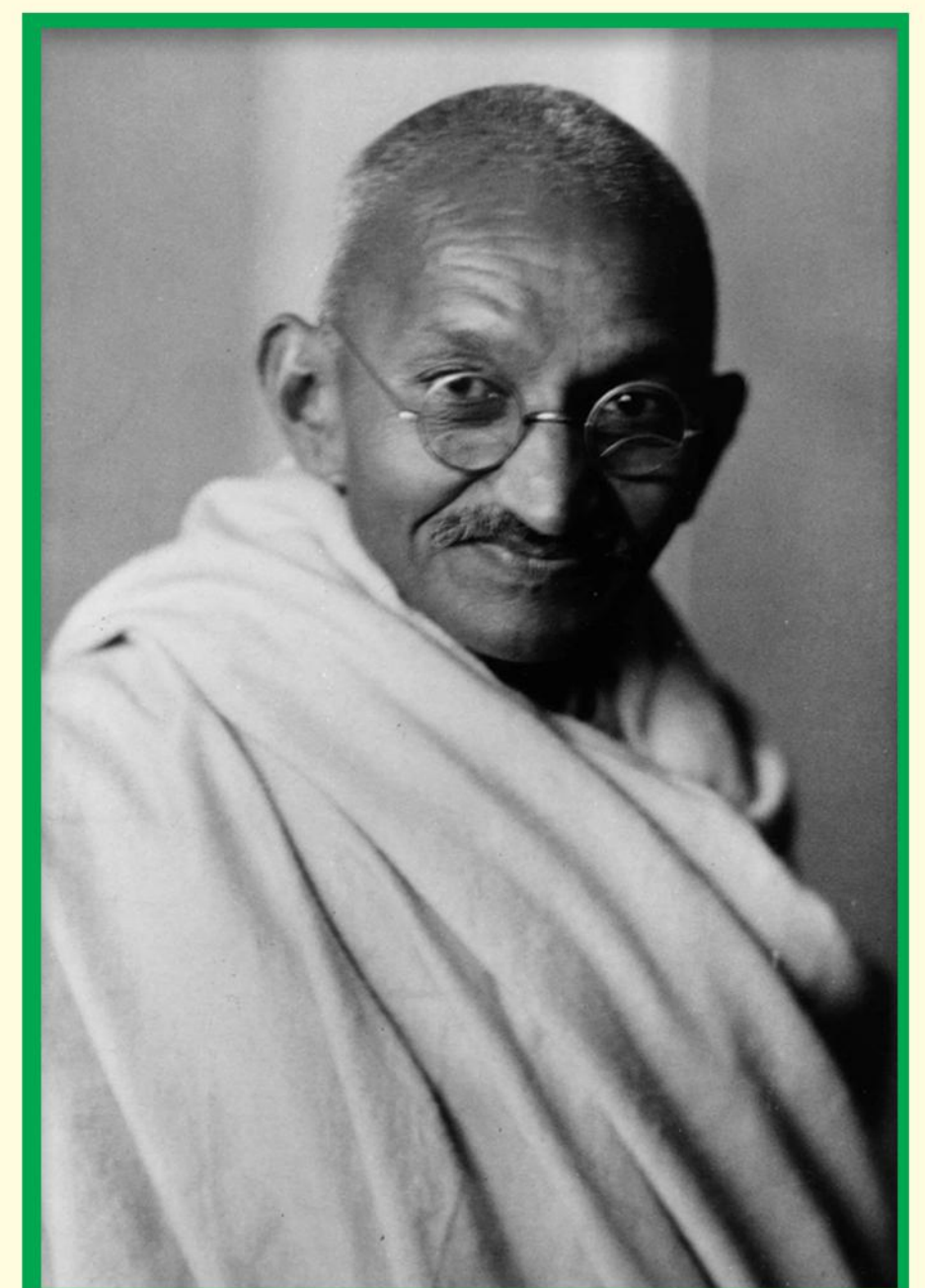
