Points of philosophy by Louis L.Hay

The bottom line of every one is, "I am not good enough". Its only a thought, and a thought can be changed.

We create every so-called illness in our body. Resentment, remorse, criticism, and guilt are the most damaging patterns. Releasing resentment will dissolve even cancer. We must release the past and forgive every one. We must be willing to begin to learn to love ourselves. Self-approval and self-acceptance are the keys to positive changes. When we really love ourselves, everything in our life works."

Resentment = a feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.

Remorse = a feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed).

Criticism = disapproval expressed by pointing out faults or shortcomings.

Constructive criticism is always appreciated and healthy.

Guilt = the state of having committed an offences.

Pattern = some thing from which a copy or a model is made.

We can change our attitude towards the past.



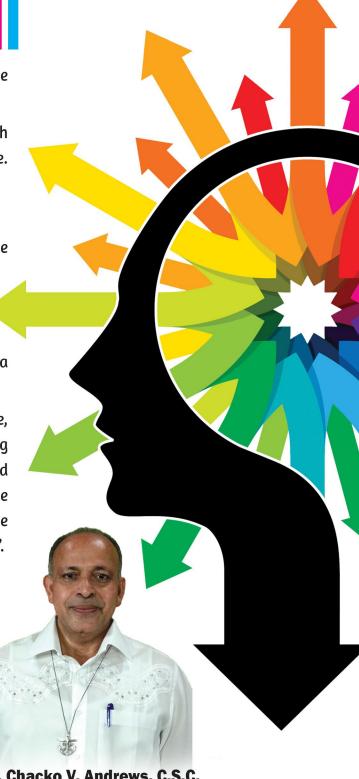

To release the past, we must be willing to forgive.

(Here two facts are important. 1. Forget 2. Forgive. We cannot forget the incident what had happened. But we could forgive the incident or event by willingly accepting, acknowledging and reconciling towards that incident. Which





means total surrendering or give up. Eg: suppose we say that we have forgiven that event or that person. But later on time to time it comes back to our mind and it disturbs our mind, we may express our anger or we may speak about it negatively on it, it continues to agitate in our mind, which means realistically we have not forgiven).



All Disease comes from a state of Un Forgiveness.

Whenever we are ill, we need to search our hearts to see who it is we need to forgive. In any miracle says that "all disease comes from a state of un forgiveness".

I would add to that concept that the very person you find it hardest to forgive is the one YOU NEED TO LET GO OF THE MOST. Forgiveness means giving up, letting go.. We do not have to know HOW to forgive. All we need to do is to be WILLING to forgive. The Universe will take care of the hows.

Eg: confession : The privilege in the Catholic Church.

I find that when we really love and accept and APPROVE OF OURSELVES EXACTLY AS WE ARE, then every thing in life works. It's as if little miracles are every where. Our health improves, we attract more money, our relationships become much more fulfilling, All this seems to happen without our even trying.

Self-approval and self-acceptance in the now are the main keys to positive changes in every areas of our lives. Loving the self, to me, begins with never ever criticizing ourselves for anything. Criticism locks us in to the very pattern we are trying to change.

I believe we create every so —called illness in our body. The body, like every thing else in life, is a mirror of our inner thoughts and beliefs. The person who has a permanently scowling face did not produce that by having joyous, loving thoughts.

Few areas are given below:

The Head:

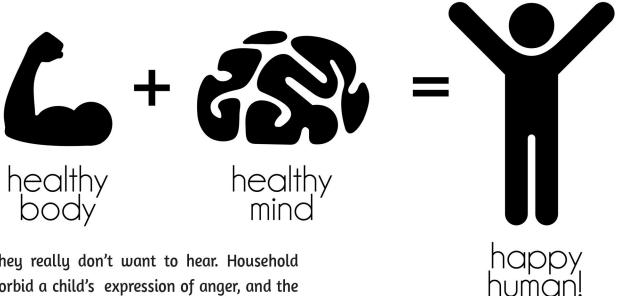
The Head represent us. It is what we show the world. It is how we are usually recognized. When some thing goes wrong in the head area, it usually means we feel something is very wrong with "us".

The Ears:

The Ears represent the capacity to hear. When we are problem with the ears, it usually means something is going on, you do not want to hear. An earache would indicate that there is anger about what is heard.

Earaches are common with the children. They often have to listen to stuff going on in the





household they really don't want to hear. Household rules often forbid a child's expression of anger, and the child's inability to change things creates an earache.

The Eyes:

The eyes represent the capacity to see. When there are problems with the eyes, it usually means there is something we do not want to see, either about ourselves or about life, past, present or future.

Whenever I see small children wearing glasses, I know there is stuff going on in their house hold they do not want to look at. If they can't change the experience, they will diffuse the sight so they don't have to see it so clearly.

Many people have had dramatic healing experiences when they have been willing to go back in to the past and clean up what it was they did not want to look at a year or two before they began wearing glasses.

Are you negating what's happening right now? What don't you want to face? Are you afraid to see the present or the future ? If you could see clearly, what would you see that you don't see now? Can you see what you are doing to yourself? Interesting questions to look at it. Isn't it.

Headache:

Headaches come from invalidating the self. The next time you get a head ache, stop and ask yourself where and how you have just made yourself wrong. Forgive yourself, let it go, and the headache will dissolve back in to the nothingness from where it came.

Migraine headaches are created by people who want to be perfect and who create a lot of pressure on themselves.

Back:

The back represents our support system. Problems with the back usually mean we feel we are not being supported. Too often we think we are only supported by our job or by our family or spouses. In reality, we are totally supported by the Universe, by life itself.

The upper back has to do with feeling the lack of emotional husband/wife/lover/ support. Mu friend/authority doesn't understand me or support me.

The middle back has to do with guilt. All that stuff that is in back of us. Are you afraid to see what is back there, or are you hiding what is back there? do you feel stabbed in the back?

Do you feel "burnt out"? Are your finances in a mess, or do you worry/tension about them excessively? Then your lower back may be bothering you. The lack of money or the fear of money will do it. The amount you have has nothing to do with it.

So many of us feel that money is the most important thing in our lives, and that we could not live without it. This is not true. There is some thing far more important and precious to us without which we could not live. What is that? It is our breath.

Our breath is the most precious substance in our lives, and yet we totally take for granted when we exhale that



our next breath will be there. If we do not take another breath, we would not last three minutes.

The Heart:

The heart, of course, represent love, while our blood represents joy. Our hearts lovingly pump joy throughout our bodies. When we deny ourselves joy and love, the heart shrivels and becomes cold. (shrivel means wrinkles and contract, denies the momentum — like plant / tree, due to the loss of moisture). As a result, the blood gets sluggish, (slow moving or inactive) and we creep our way to ANEMIA, (anemia is a condition in which you lack enough healthy red blood cells to carry adequate oxygen to your body tissues, low hemoglobin) ANGINA, (angina means severe pain in the chest, it also spread to the shoulders, arms, and neck due to inadequate blood supply to the heart) AND HEART ATTACKS.

The heart does not "attack " us. We get so caught up in the soap opera and dramas we create that we often forget to notice the little joys that surround us. We spend years squeezing all the joy out of the heart, and it literally falls over in pain. Heart attack people are never joyous people. If they do not take the time to appreciate the joys of life, they will just recreate another heart attack in time.

Treatment: I bring joy back to the center of my heart. I express love to all.





Heart of gold, cold heart, open heart, black heart, loving heart, warm hearted – where is your heart?

The stomach:

The Stomach digests all the new ideas and experiences we have. What or who can't you stomach? What gets you in the guts?

When there are stomach problems, it usually means we don't know how to assimilate the new experience. We are afraid.

Many of us remember when commercial airplanes first became popular. That we could get inside a big metal tube that would carry us safely through the sky was a new idea we found hard to assimilate.

Now it is many years later, and though the bags are still at every seat, they are seldom used. We have assimilated the idea of flying.



Accidents are no accident. Like every thing else in our lives, we create them. It's not that we necessarily say, "I want to have an accident," but we do have the mental thought patterns that can attract an accident to us. Some people seem to be "accident prone," and others go for a life time without ever getting a scratch.

Accidents are expressions of anger. They indicate built-up frustrations resulting from not feeling the freedom to speak up for one's self. Accidents also indicate rebellion

against authority, rebellion against (other driver) other person. Believe in violence, We get so mad we want to hit people, and instead, we get hit.

When we are angry at ourselves, when we feel guilty, when we feel the need for punishment, an accident is a marvelous way of taking care of that.

Superstitious believers say that it is a fate. But it is not. It seems as though any accident is not our fault, that we are helpless victims of a quirk of fate. An accident allows us to turn to others for sympathy and attention. We get our wounds bathed and attended to. We often get bed rest, sometimes for an extended period of time. And we get pain.

Remedy: I am at peace. I am worthwhile.

CANCER:

Cancer is a dis-ease caused by deep resentment/remorse (a feeling of deep anger or displeasure stemming from belief that one has been wronged by others or betrayed) held for a long time until it literally eats away at the body. Some thing happens in childhood that destroys the sense of trust. This experience is never forgotten, and the individual lives with a sense of self – pity, finding it hard to develop and maintain long term, meaningful relationships, because of that belief system, life seems to be a series of disappointments. A feeling of hopelessness and helplessness. and it becomes easy to blame others for all our problems. People with cancer are also very self – critical, deep hurt and hatredness, what is the use?

To me, learning to love and accept the self is the key to healing cancers.

Treament: I lovingly forgive and release all of the past. I choose to fill my world with joy. I love and approve of myself.

7 C'S OF SUCCESS

While on vacation at the serene riverfront residency of Jeevan Jyoti Industrial Training Institute, our hospitable host Brother Anthony Raj introduced us to a batch of 90 enthusiastic students and requested me to give them some talk. F.r Rohan Almeida, a Jesuit school principal who was on a personal retreat,

effectively translated my impromptu talk on the 7 C's of Success in the local language, which was well received by the students.

I am summarising here my thoughts about success based on personal experience, which may give you some perspective on how to achieve it.

Success is defined as a "favourable or desired outcome" and "attainment of wealth, favour, fame or eminence" Success could be self or family or societal fulfillment. But how does one achieve success? Let me tell you that success is a continuous, disciplined process whose ultimate fruits are sweet and gratifying.

Encapsulated here are my 7 C's of Success:

1.Competence

It's your ability to build skills and attitude that makes you different from others. Master your knowledge base



in the field you're in. Your knowledge cannot be copied by anyone. Push hard for what you want, focus and be passionate in what you do. You must have a learning mindset; learn the latest skills and keep yourself updated constantly. Persist through failure, rejection and criticism. Believe in yourself and reinforce your mind every day by visualizing success. Set yourself short time goals and work hard to fulfill them within the timeline. As Thomas Edison said, Success is 1% inspiration and 99% perspiration. Work hard and try to be in the top 20% percentile of your peers.



2.Concepts

With knowledge and competence, success comes to those who bring new ideas or concepts to the table. It is your ability to apply your knowledge to problems never before encountered and drawing inferences from facts already known. Ideas can be generated through intent listening, observation and having a childlike curiosity. Ask questions, do problem solving and make connections. Brainstorming with friends and colleagues is a good way to generate ideas. Read on a variety of subjects and surf the net to build awareness. An idea can sometimes be so obvious that no one else has considered it. Your own ideas, will and ability can create a number of chances, circumstances, and the atmosphere to reach the desired goal.

3.Communication

Competence and ideas need to be communicated well. More than what you say, how you say it matters. Communication involves sharing ideas, information, and messages and includes writing and talking, as well as non-verbal communication (such as facial expressions, body language, or gestures), visual communication (the use of images, video or film), and electronic communication (telephone calls. mails). Communication is critical for human interactions. Most successful people have excellent communication skills. For starters, build up a good vocabulary (Learn 5 new words every day) and grammar. Smile as you speak and make use of gestures and body language to reinforce your point of view. Learning one or two more languages will widen your reach. Using simple, easy to understand language will endear you to your audience. Make eye contact and speak with confidence and assertiveness. If needed, join a public speaking course.

4.Collaboration

No man is an island. We are living in an interconnected world and working with people of diverse backgrounds, cultures and biases. Collaboration is not just team work but a fusion of ideas for the common good.





To effectively collaborate you need to have people skills. Understand what motivates people around you and empathize by putting yourself in their shoes. It helps you see other points of view and not get locked into your own way of thinking all the time. When other people see that you empathize with them, they'll feel understood, leading to a mutual feeling of trust and lasting relationships. You can acquire people skills by being friendly and understanding. Things change all the time so it's important to be flexible and adaptive. For starters, read and re-read the all-time best seller book "How to Win Friends and Influence People" by Dale Carnegie. You can effectively collaborate if you are clear and assertive in communicating your ideas, be a patient listener, empathize and resolve conflicts amicably. Participate in community and social events and make as many friends as you can.

5.Courage

Some of the most successful creations, inventions and movements of history are because one individual chose to embrace courage over fear and ridicule. We'll always face obstacles en route to success, but with courage and boldness, these could be overcome smoothly. Success comes to those who take balanced and calculated risks before making any important decision. Believe in your capabilities. Always be a fighter and never be a quitter. Winners never quit; quitters never win. Set your mind on your goal and just focus with a commitment and consistence to succeed. Seek help. It takes courage to ask for help when you're stuck, overwhelmed or don't know the answer to an issue, and you will be amazed by the positive responses. One of the biggest motivators in overcoming fear is knowing that you're not alone.

There are others who are cheering you on and offering advice and encouragement. Make a list, a long list of everything that scares you and slowly tackle each one by one. Start small and build up. Just like exercising a muscle, exercise your courage. The more often you do so the stronger you will become and the more confidence you will develop to tackle bigger and bigger challenges.



6.Commitment

Everyone has the same 1,440 minutes in a day so be selective about what and who you commit to. One of the most distinguishing characteristics of successful people is their dogged persistence. Unfortunately, most people quit when they hit the first difficulty. They take the easy way out by quitting. That's why they seldom succeed at anything. However, when you're committed, you neither offer nor accept any excuses, only tangible results. Keep long-term and short-term goals. Commit to things like open-mindedness, time management and integrity. Be focused and do not allow distractions to side-track you. Keep an actionable plan and commit all your resources to achieve it on a day-to -day basis. Believe in yourself. Write down your strengths, unique points, greatest achievements and accomplishments and read them aloud every morning to build your confidence. Meditate in a quiet place for a few minutes every day. Share your goals and dreams openly. Share your thoughts with people who support you. It takes courage to share a goal with someone else. And when you do, it makes you serious and more committed to achieving it. People should see that you are credible and a person of principles who they can trust.

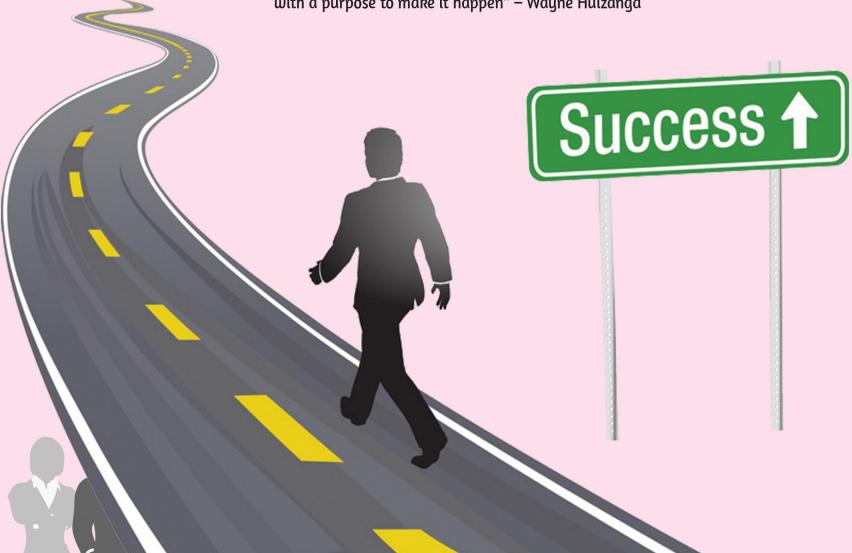

When you master the above 7 ('5 you'll have people flocking to seek your friendship and favour.

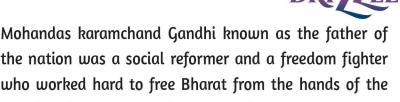

MOTOR MECHANICAL VEHICLE (MMV)

I, Aditya Patagar studying at Jeevan Jyothi Industrial Training Institute would like to brief to you the importance of MMV course I have chosen to study. MMV stands for 'Motor Mechanical Vehicle'. It is a two years course. During the two years duration a candidate is trained on subjects, professional skill, Professional knowledge, engineering drawing, workshop calculation and science and employability skills. In addition to this a candidate is entrusted to make a project work and extracurricular activities to build up the confidence. The practical skills are imparted on simple to complex manner and simultaneously theory subject is taught in the same fashion on explain cognitive knowledge well executing tasks the board components covered under professional skills.





First year: This year will cover the safety aspect in general and specific to the trade, identification of tools and equipment, raw material used. The trainee will perform measuring and making tools. The trainee will be able to plan and perform basic functioning and fitting operating, familiarize with the basic of electricity test and measure the electrical parameters skilling practice making various welding joint by using arc and gas welding. Trace and identify various hydraulics brake system identify various types of vehicles.

The candidate will be able to perform practice on dismantling residential of LMV as per given standard procedures able to achieve skill on overhauling of cylinder head valve, train piston connecting rod assembly, crankshaft flywheel and mounting flanges and bearings camshaft etc. Practice reassembling all parts of engine in correct sequence as per workshop manual. Perform testing on engine also the trainee practice on repair and maintenance of cooling lubrication, intake and exhaust system of engine. Perform maintenance of diesel fuel system FIP governor and monitor emission of vehicle. Practice on repair maintenance and overhaul of stator alternator and perform troubleshooting in engine of LMV or HMV

Second year: In the second year, the trainee will learn to perform overhauling of cylinder light vehicle, heavy vehicle transmission units including gearbox, single plate clutch assembly, diaphragm clutch assembly, constant mesh gear box linkages propeller shaft universal slip joint real axle assembly, differential assembly the specifications and tolerances for the vehicle and the manufacturers approved overhauling methods standard repair methods health,

safety requirement etc. The trainee will learn how to overall repair and service shackles leaf spring front axle front and rear suspension steering gear box worn and roller type steering gearbox. plating reticulating ball type master cylinder, front and rear brake wheel cylinder vacuum booster air servo unit air tank etc. The trainee will also learn to carry out wheel balancing alignment within acceptable limits.

Navratri is a festival in which people joyously worship Goddess Durga. Indians celebrate this festival with a lot of joy and enthusiasm. Further, the meaning of 'Nav' is nine and 'Ratri' refers to night. We celebrate it over a period of nine nights.

The story behind Navratri

We celebrate the festival for nine nights and ten days. The festival occurs in the month of October or November. Moreover, in India, people celebrate it four times every year. We refer to these times as Sharada Navratri, Vasanta Navratri, Magha Navratri and Ashada Navratri. Further, the most famous one is Sharada Navaratri that people all over the country celebrate actively. The people living in the North-eastern and Eastern states refer to it as Durga Puja. According to the holy scriptures, Mahishasura was a demon king. Also, he was an ardent worshipper of Lord Siva and got massive powers.

Missing his power, he committed a lot of wrongdoings and troubled the people. Thus, the holy trinity of Brahma, Vishnu, and Siva decided to do something. In other words, all their powers got together to create Goddess Durga.

It was done to protect the world from the demon king. Thus, in the Northern, Western and Southern states, people refer to this festival as Rama Lila. Similarly, people also refer to it as Dussehra in these regions. Dussehra is known for symbolizing the victory of Lord Rama over Raavan, the demon king.

Nine Days of Celebrations

We celebrate the nine days of this festival as a dedication to the nine incarnations of the Goddess Durga. First day, she is an incarnation of Goddess Parvati. She is depicted as the direct incarnation of Mahakali. Second day, she is the incarnation of Goddess Parvati only but of her unmarried self. The colour of the day blue, symbolizes peace and strength. Third day, yellow is the colour. It symbolizes the vivaciousness of Goddess Parvati. Fourth day, refers to the universe's creative power. Green is the colour that is associated with this form. Fifth day, the colour is grey and it symbolizes strength. Sixth day she is depicted with four arms as she rides a lion, a symbol of courage. Orange is the colour for the sixth day. Seventh day shows the most violent form of the Goddess, Mahakali. Her skin turns back in rage for destroying demons. Eighth day, peace and optimism are associated with pink colour.

Finally, on the ninth day, she sits on a lotus radiating the wisdom and beauty of nature. Light blue is the colour of the final day. People celebrate and worship all forms of the Goddess enthusiastically. Navratri brings people together from all over the country and symbolizes diversity and culture.

DEEPAVALI

Deepavali (also Diwali) is one of the India's biggest festivals and is certainly the festival that has received the most attention from the international community. Diwali is observed across the religious spectrum. The name Diwali derived from the rows of lamps that people light outside their houses and temples as a symbol of the internal light that protects against spiritual darkness. INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE GIRL CHILD

History

The Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action in 1995 for the first time in history, proposed action to advance the rights of the girl child. Following that, in December 2011, the United Nations General Assembly adopted resolution 66/170 and inaugurated October 11, 2012 as the first year to celebrate the day. The declaration highlighted the need to liberate and

The resolution further dives into a girl's inability to access opportunities, enjoy her rights, and face problems since her childhood and adolescence. It adds that child and forced marriages lead to a greater risk of HIV and sexually transmitted diseases in young girls, often leading to early childbearing and heightening the chances of disability, stillbirth, and maternal death.

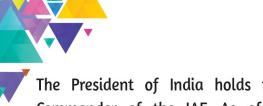

After India gained independence from United Kingdom in 1947, the name Royal Indian Air Force was kept and served in the name of Dominion of India. With the government's transition to a Republic in 1950, the prefix Royal was removed. Since 1950, the IAF has been involved in four wars with neighbouring Pakistan. Other major operations undertaken by the IAF include Operation Vijay, Operation Meghdoot, Operation Cactus and Operation Poomalai. The IAF's mission expands beyond engagement with hostile forces, with the IAF participating in United Nations peacekeeping missions.



The President of India holds the rank of Supreme Commander of the IAF. As of 1 July 2017, 170,576 personnel are in service with the Indian Air Force. The Chief of the Air Staff, an air chief marshal, is a four-star officer and is responsible for the bulk of operational command of the Air Force. There is never more than one serving ACM at any given time in the IAF.

The rank of Marshal of the Air Force has been conferred by the President of India on one occasion in history, to Arjan Singh. On 26 January 2002, Singh became the first and so far, only five-star rank officer of the IAF.
